

One-time overrides

Publicity pamphlet

[Arizona Revised Statutes §41-563.02](#) requires a county, city, or town to prepare and print publicity pamphlets presenting the proposed one-time override to be voted upon and related information. The county, city, or town must mail one copy of the publicity pamphlet to each household containing a registered voter not less than 10 days and not more than 30 days before the election.

The publicity pamphlets must contain the following information:

1. The election date
2. The polling places' names and locations and the times they are open
3. A true and complete copy of the one-time override of the constitutional expenditure limitation's title and text
4. The form in which the proposed one-time override will appear on the ballot, the official title, a descriptive title that the clerk of the board of supervisors or the city or town clerk prepared, and the number by which the measure will be designated
5. The specific amount of expenditures that will exceed the constitutional expenditure limitation
6. A statement of the purposes for which the county, city, or town will use the excess expenditures and the revenue sources that it will use to finance the excess expenditures
7. Arguments for and against the proposed excess expenditures, including a governing board prepared argument for the proposal

Official ballot

In addition to any other ballot requirements prescribed by law, the official ballot must include the following information:

1. The proposed one-time override's official title and number
2. A statement that the governing board referred the one-time override to be voted upon
3. A descriptive title not to exceed 50 words that includes a summary of the principal provisions of the proposed one-time override, which the clerk of the board of supervisors or the city or town clerk shall prepare

After the election, if a majority of the voters approves the one-time override, the clerk of the board of supervisors or the city or town clerk should submit to the Auditor General a copy of the publicity pamphlet and the election results' official canvass to support the annual expenditure limitation report.
