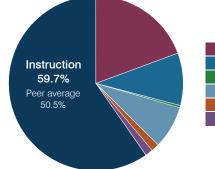

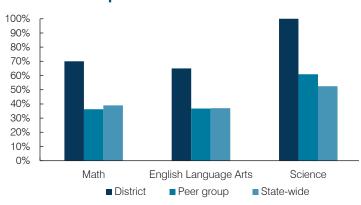

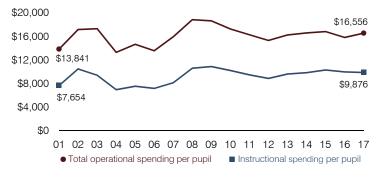

5-year spending trend (2012 through 2017)

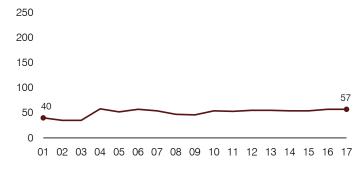
Administrative cost per pupil

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, increased by 8 percent. The percentage of dollars spent on instruction increased overall from 57.9 to 59.7 percent. As a percentage of total operational spending, some noninstructional areas varied year to year, as is common for very small districts. Overall, plant operations, transportation, and instruction support decreased substantially.

Total operational and instructional spending per pupil (inflation adjusted to 2017 dollars)

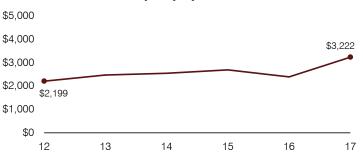

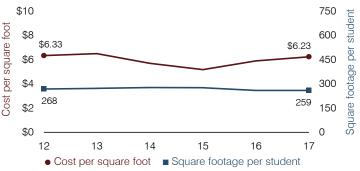
