



Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher and counselor earned between \$7,574 and \$7,744 in additional salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on district performance.
- High school students increased their reading and math scores on standardized tests.
- The writing goals for AIMS scores were not achieved, but freshmen students increased their reading, writing, and math scores on the Terra Nova.
- The student dropout rate decreased.
- Other goals called for teachers to participate in professional development activities and decrease their number of absences.

Menu

- Monies were primarily used to increase eligible employee compensation.
- Monies were also used to hire a part-time teacher to focus on AIMS intervention activities. According to the District, the 60 students participating in the AIMS intervention program improved their AIMS test scores.
- Another part-time teacher was hired to help reduce class sizes.
