

Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.06 percent of the District's \$30,457,176 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,495; each counselor earned an additional \$3,138; and each librarian earned an additional \$2,353 in salary.
- Teachers earned performance pay for participating in activities aimed at increasing student achievement and for accomplishing school-based student achievement goals.
- 9 new teachers were hired to reduce class sizes.
- Teachers were contracted to work 2 additional days to allow more opportunities for staff development.
- New teachers started work 1 week early to receive additional training to enable them to be more effective teachers.
