



Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.08 percent of the District's \$17,206,622 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher, counselor, and librarian earned an additional \$2,787 in salary.
- Students at each school demonstrated progress as measured by district assessments aligned to the AIMS test.
- 2.5 teachers were hired to reduce class sizes and to accommodate 13.5 percent growth in the District.
- Student attendance increased by 0.6 percent.
- Monies also paid for teacher development activities.
