



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, and counselor earned between \$4,057 and \$4,782 in additional salary, and each instructional aide earned an average of \$203.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were the same as the prior fiscal year's goals and were based on school and individual performance.
- Students demonstrated 1 year's growth on standardized test scores.
- Students shadowed employees at a local copper mine and learned resume writing and interviewing skills.
- Other goals were linked to professional development activities, student and teacher attendance, dropout rate, performance evaluations, tutoring, and communication with parents through newsletters and conferences.
