



District-reported 2004 results

Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher earned an additional \$2,819 in salary, and each speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned \$2,012 to \$2,050.
 An adult education teacher also earned \$625 in performance pay.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district-wide performance.
- The percentage of students reaching benchmarks and/or students' average test scores increased in reading, writing, and math.
- 92 percent of teachers participated in curriculum committees and meetings.
- 13 percent of teachers served as mentors.
- 57 percent of teachers completed at least 15 hours of technology training, and 66 percent attended classes focused on best practices and language arts.
- 9 new teachers attended a summer training program.
- 9 other teachers completed a semester of Spanishlanguage training.

Menu

- 3 teachers were hired to maintain class sizes.
- Teachers earned bonuses for student achievement.
- Monies were also used to increase eligible employee compensation and to pay relocation stipends.
