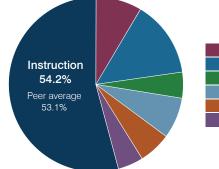

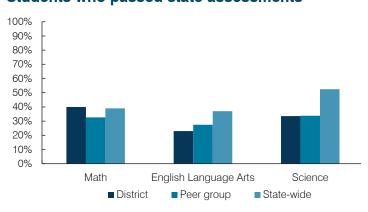

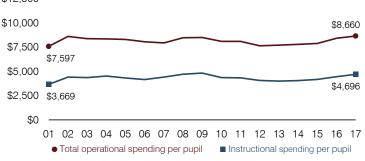
5-year spending trend (2012 through 2017)

Administrative cost per pupil

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, increased by 13 percent. The percentage of dollars spent on instruction varied year to year, increasing slightly overall from 53.3 to 54.2 percent. Overall, as a percentage of total operational spending, plant operations decreased, while transportation and instruction support increased slightly. Other noninstructional areas remained fairly stable.

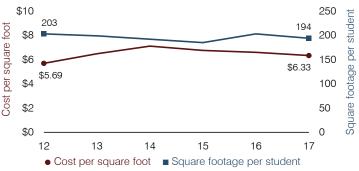
Total operational and instructional spending per pupil (inflation adjusted to 2017 dollars)



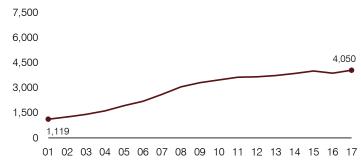

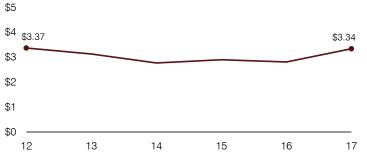
Plant cost per square foot and square footage per student

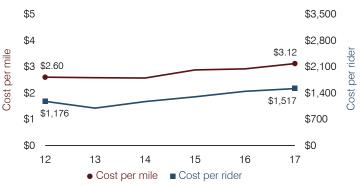
