



Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.77 percent of the District's \$16,566,694 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$4,100 in compensation.
- Department chairs received additional compensation for added responsibilities.
- All 185 teachers accomplished the performance goal of achieving 2 percent improvement in student reading, math, and language arts scores. The District's average improvement was 8 percent.
- Monies were also paid to develop mini assessments for state curriculum and for after-school tutoring, summer school, and recovery school. Recovery school enabled 12 of 49 participating junior-high students, and 43 of 55 participating high-school students, to earn passing grades in courses.
