## District-reported 2003 results

## Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher and counselor earned between $\$ 5,838$ and $\$ 6,532$ in additional salary.


## Performance

- The District accomplished its performance goals, which were based on district performance.
- The District's PASS program assists students who are earning failing grades or who have attendance problems to receive additional tutoring, instruction, and counseling. 48 percent of the 1,215 students referred to the program improved their grades to a C or better. Additionally, attendance problems were minimized for 48 percent of students referred to PASS.


## Menu

- An instructional aide was hired to reduce automotive class sizes and to help work with students.
- Teachers earned up to $\$ 1,000$ each, or $\$ 500$ per semester, for having 1 or fewer absences during the year. 63 percent of teachers earned monies the first semester, and 47 percent earned monies the second.
- Teachers also earned $\$ 1$ per student placed in a job.
