



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, counselor, and nurse earned \$5,211 in additional salary, and each occupational and physical therapist earned an additional \$2,942.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on individual and school performance.
- All certified staff were compensated \$50 per hour for up to 40 hours to address academic progress, including analyzing test scores and developing course common assessments to measure incremental progress, on-going curriculum mapping, and tutoring students in specific areas of academic weakness.
- The district achieved an 80 percent graduation rate.
- The district shared parent survey responses with the public and addressed all major concerns identified in the prior fiscal year's parent surveys.
