



Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.05 percent of the District's \$8,887,092 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$2,300 in compensation.
- Teacher retention increased.
- All 90 teachers accomplished performance goals involving increased student achievement on standardized tests, satisfactory performance evaluations, and completion of at least 40 hours of professional development.
- Monies were also used to hire 3 teachers for the staff development department and to purchase training supplies. The new department created a course development catalog of classes available to teachers.
