



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher earned an additional \$5,655 in salary, and each librarian and counselor earned between \$2,960 and \$4,624.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district, school, and individual performance.
- Eligible employees earned performance pay based on the percentage of students who met or exceeded standards in reading, writing, and math on the AIMS test.
- The student attendance rate was at least 95 percent.
- Each teacher selected an individual goal focused on either parent involvement, professional development, leadership, tutoring, or extracurricular activities.
- One goal was linked to the District's graduation rate.

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- Monies were primarily used to increase eligible employee compensation.
- Teacher development monies were used to send a media specialist to a state librarian conference.
- Dropout prevention monies were used to provide an end-of-term field trip for passing middle school students.
