

Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, and counselor earned between \$4,099 and \$5,541 in additional salary. In addition, instructional aides, speech pathologists, and audiologists earned approximately \$2,060 each in performance pay, and the development coordinator earned \$3,389 in performance pay.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- Goals were linked to improved students' reading, language arts, and math scores on standardized tests and other assessments.

Menu

- Monies were used for professional development activities, including hiring a professional development coordinator and assistant, and paying outside instructors to provide trainings.
