## District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

- The teacher earned an additional $\$ 2,483$ in salary. In addition, instructional aides were eligible for menu monies and each earned an additional \$452.


## Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school performance.
- Each student demonstrated 1 year's academic progress on standardized tests.
- Special education student progress met Individualized Education Program (IEP) benchmarks.


## Menu

- Monies were used to compensate 1 teacher and 2 instructional aides for completing professional development activities. Courses included reading, technology, special education, CPR, first aid, and behavioral analysis.
