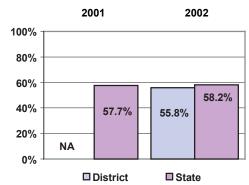

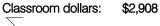

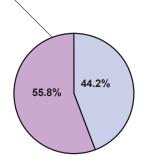

Proposition 301 expenditures were 4.78 percent of the District's \$34,194,859 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

#### District-reported 2002 results

- On average, teachers earned an additional \$3,205 in salary.
- Teachers accomplished performance goals involving their satisfactory performance evaluations, additional duties, and attendance.
- 5 computer instructors were added in the elementary level, which reduced class sizes as teachers were not drawn from regular classrooms to teach these courses.
- Guidance counselors, security personnel, and a student advocate were hired, which facilitated weekly meetings with students concerning grades and attendance, and resulted in more students passing classes and staying in school.
