



District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned an additional \$3,375 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on individual performance.
- Most teachers and other eligible employees received acceptable performance ratings and completed at least 1 of 15 individual performance goals.

Menu

- The District hired 1 math and 6 computer teachers, and 5 teaching assistants to reduce class sizes, and paid 17 teachers for providing additional instruction.
- For AIMS intervention, 2 math tutors were hired and a homework center was established.
- For dropout prevention, monies help pay for campus security, 3 counselors, and a part-time guidance clerk.
- Monies were also used to increase eligible employee compensation and pay for professional development activities.
