



Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher earned an additional \$5,768 in salary, and the Reading First Coordinator earned an additional \$2,904.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on fiscal year 2006 school performance.
- The percentage of students meeting or exceeding reading, math, and writing standards on standardized tests increased from the prior fiscal year.
- The goal not met required the District to decrease its dropout rate.

Menu

- 50 percent of monies were distributed to teachers having received an evaluation with no areas needing improvement and/or rated as unsatisfactory.
- The remaining 50 percent of monies were distributed to teachers who completed 24 hours of extracurricular instruction or activities with students and/or parents.
