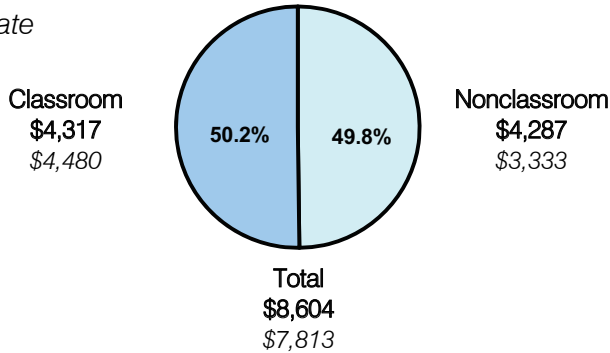

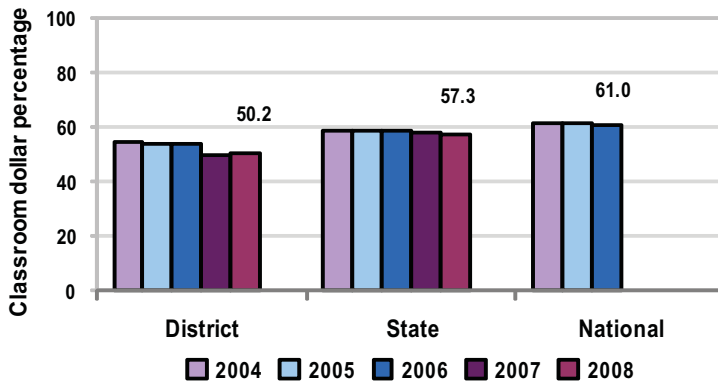
Fiscal year 2008 averages per pupil

### Proposition 301

#### District-reported 2008 results

##### Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher and counselor earned between \$5,500 and \$5,608 in additional salary.

##### Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- Schools achieved Adequate Yearly Progress, and were labeled "Performing" by ADE for AZ LEARNS.
- Eligible employees participated in tutoring to help improve student achievement.
- Parents and students responding to a survey indicated that they were satisfied with the District.
- Counselors helped students work toward graduation and college by reviewing transcripts and escorting students on college visits.
- Other goals were linked to student attendance, teacher attendance and evaluations, professional development, parent involvement, leadership, and counseling progress.

##### Menu

- Monies were used solely to increase eligible employee compensation to attract and retain the best possible employees.
