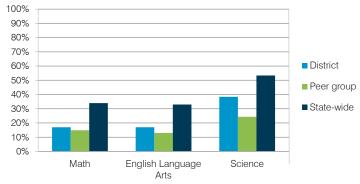

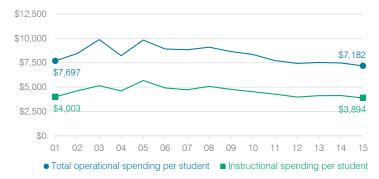

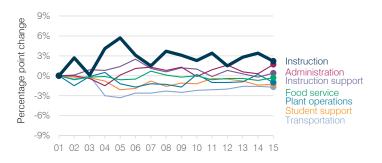
5-year spending trend (2010 through 2015)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, decreased by 14 percent. The percentage of dollars spent in the classroom varied year to year, ranging overall from a high of 55.4 to a low of 53.5 percent. Overall, as a percentage of total operational spending, administration increased and transportation increased slightly, while plant operations decreased and instruction support decreased slightly.

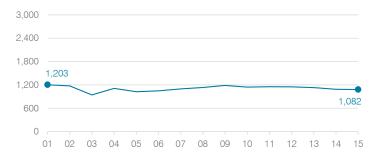
Total operational and instructional spending per student (inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars)



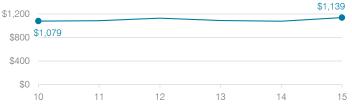
Changes in operational spending percentages

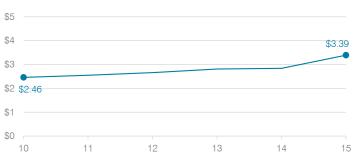






Plant cost per square foot and square footage per student
