## District-reported 2004 results

## Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned between $\$ 3,050$ and $\$ 3,132$ in additional salary. This does not include a portion of performance pay distributed in fiscal year 2005 nor menu monies paid to teachers who instructed professional development courses.


## Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- The percentage of students meeting or exceeding state reading standards increased by 5,8 , and 10 percent, respectively, at 3 schools.
- 98 percent of teachers received acceptable performance evaluations.
- Most teachers completed up to 45 hours of professional development activities.


## Menu

- Monies were primarily used to increase eligible employee compensation.
- Monies were also used to pay for professional development activities. 40 teachers earned up to $\$ 1,500$ each for instructing or assisting with professional development courses.
