



#### Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were the same as the prior fiscal year's goals and were based on school and individual performance.
- At least 80 percent of students had to demonstrate proficiency in reading, writing, and math on the AIMS test or show at least 7 percent growth over the prior year's test scores.
- Teachers were paid for being absent no more than 7 days during the school year.
- The District met most of its goals pertaining to dropout/graduation and student attendance rates.

#### Menu

- Monies were used primarily to increase teacher compensation.
- Certified staff participated in 1 to 2 days of professional development activities.
- For AIMS intervention, the District implemented an academic mentoring program, which provided before- and after-school mentoring as well as Saturday school sessions. 38 percent of the student population attended at least 1 mentoring session.
