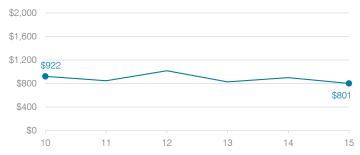

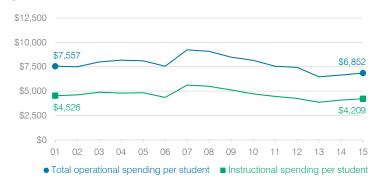
#### 5-year spending trend (2010 through 2015)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, decreased by 16 percent. The percentage of dollars spent in the classroom varied year to year, increasing overall from 57.8 to 61.4 percent. Overall, as a percentage of total operational spending, plant operations decreased substantially and administration and instruction support decreased slightly. Food service increased slightly.

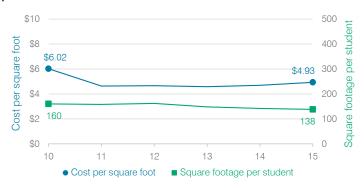
### Administrative cost per student



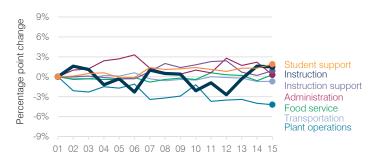
## Total operational and instructional spending per student (inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars)



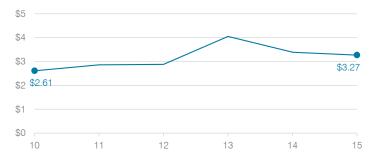
# Plant cost per square foot and square footage per student



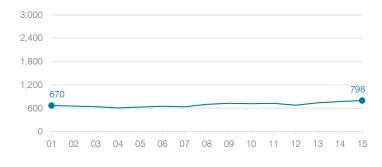
#### Changes in operational spending percentages
