



District-reported 2008 results

Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, counselor, psychologist, nurse, social worker, and special education coordinator earned an additional \$4,822 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were the same as the prior fiscal year's goals and were based on school and individual performance.
- Each school set and accomplished 3 student achievement goals based on standardized test results.
- Each teacher completed 15 hours of professional development activities and was evaluated on the development and presentation of lesson plans which supported the schools' academic goals.
- Other goals were linked to parent-student satisfaction.

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- Monies were used to continue to pay salaries for 7 elementary and 7 secondary teachers to reduce class sizes.
- Monies were also used to increase teacher compensation.
