



Proposition 301 expenditures were 3.06 percent of the District's \$4,628,688 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

#### District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher, counselor, and librarian earned an additional \$2,923 in salary.
- 62 students received after-school tutoring in reading and mathematics.
- 48 teachers participated in a writing training course; 26 teachers participated in computer technology courses for college credit; and 32 teachers participated in a workshop focusing on students who are at risk of underperforming on standardized tests.
- Teachers were compensated for developing curriculum and assessments, mentoring new teachers, and working on committees.
