



### District-reported 2003 results

### Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, and counselor earned an additional \$2,213 in salary, which does not include performance pay distributed in fiscal year 2004.

### Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on district, school, and individual performance.
- Goals focused on increasing student achievement in writing and reading as measured by district assessments and standardized tests.

### Menu

- Monies were used to compensate 14 teachers for providing after-school tutoring.
- Teachers participated in aligning curriculum to state standards.
- Primary school teachers developed math assessments and mentored students.
- 140 at-risk students participated in after-school programs.
