## Proposition 301

District-reported 2004 results
Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher and librarian earned between $\$ 2,029$ and $\$ 2,136$ in additional salary. Additionally, the instructional aide earned $\$ 500$ from performance pay.


## Performance

- The District accomplished a portion of its goal, which was based on district-wide performance.
- The goal was linked to increased students' standardized test scores in reading, math, and language arts. Students' scores increased 13 percent in language arts, on average.


## Menu

- 1 kindergarten and 1 5th-grade teacher were hired to reduce class sizes.
- Monies were used to increase eligible employee compensation.
- Additionally, 19 teachers earned monies for completing up to 3 professional development workshops each.
