



District-reported 2003 results

Teacher pay

• On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned between \$3,319 and \$3,395 in additional salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on district performance.
- The District's goals called for a 1 percent improvement over 2001 AIMs test scores in reading, writing, and math for grades 3, 5, 8, and 10.

Menu

- Monies were used primarily to increase new teachers' salaries and to pay for 2 additional days of professional development.
- Monies were also used to increase the District's contribution toward employee health costs.
