

District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned \$3,768, each counselor earned \$3,709, and each librarian earned \$3,772 in additional compensation.
- 75 percent of students improved their writing skills.
- Monies were also used to pay teachers who completed 3 graduate credit hours, attended or conducted 20 hours of workshops, and mentored others or worked on committees for 20 hours.
