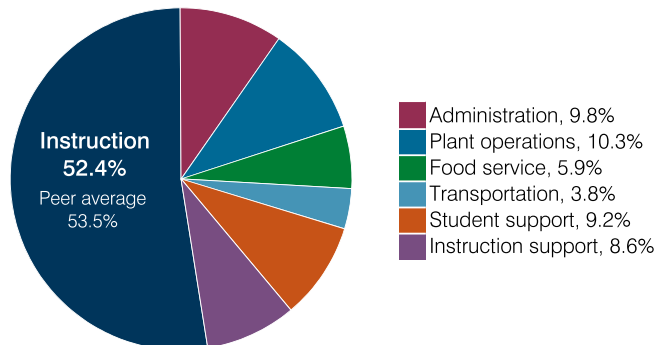

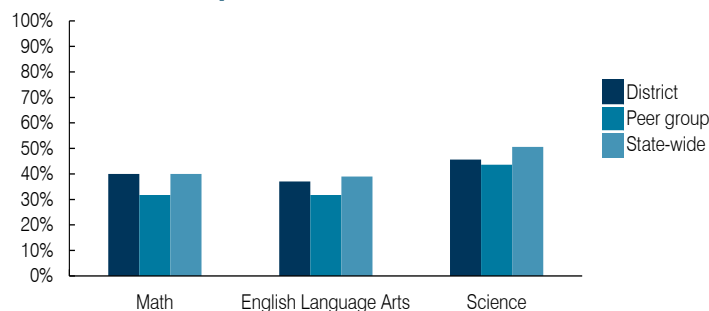

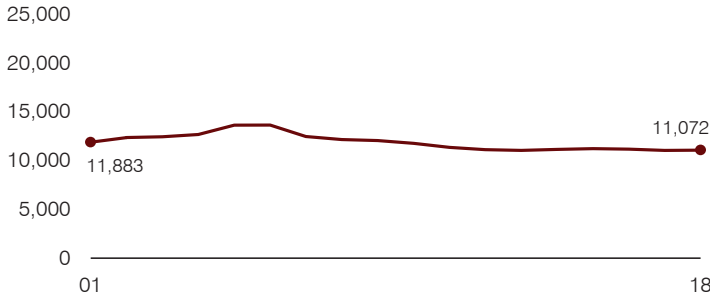

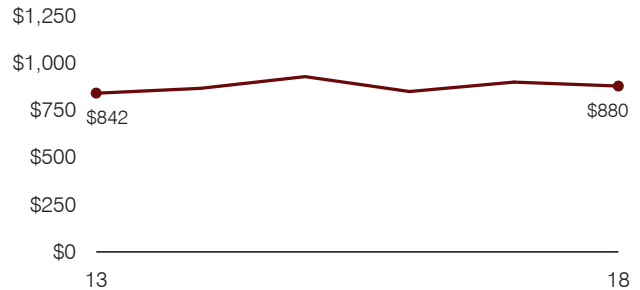

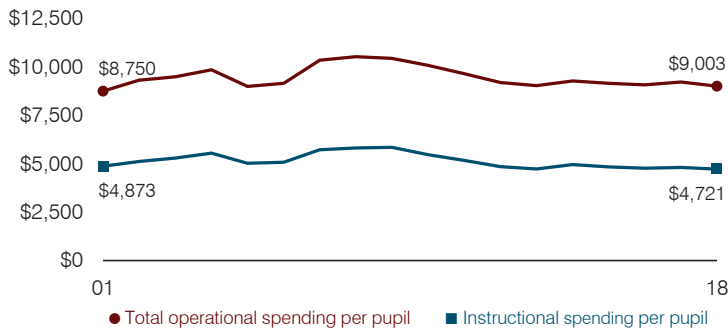

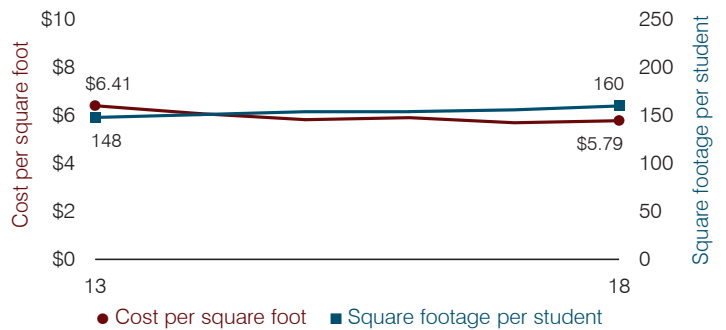
**Administrative cost per pupil**



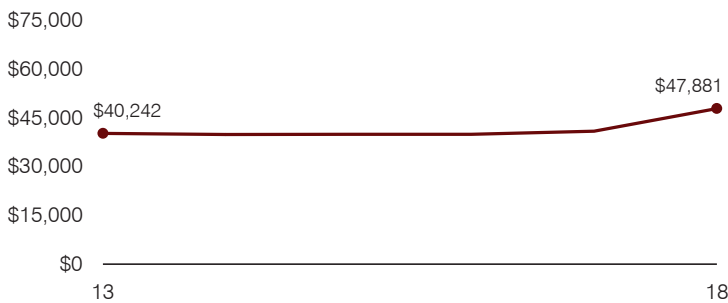
**Total operational and instructional spending per pupil (inflation adjusted to 2018 dollars)**



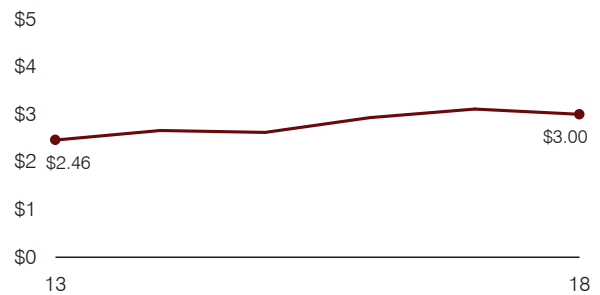
**Plant cost per square foot and square footage per student**
