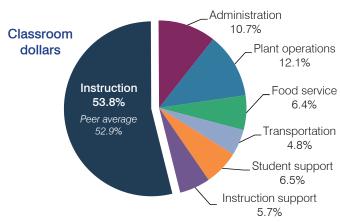

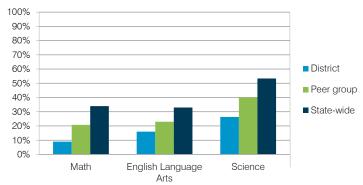

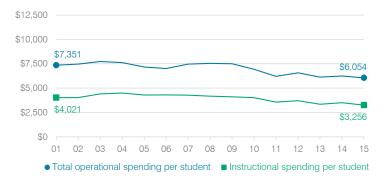

5-year spending trend (2010 through 2015)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, decreased by 13 percent. The percentage of dollars spent in the classroom varied year to year, decreasing overall from 57.9 to 53.8 percent. As a percentage of total operational spending, food service increased substantially and student support increased, while plant operations decreased. Most other nonclassroom areas remained fairly stable.

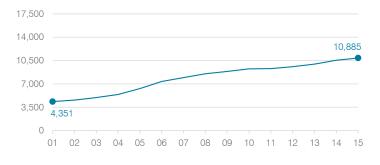
Total operational and instructional spending per student (inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars)



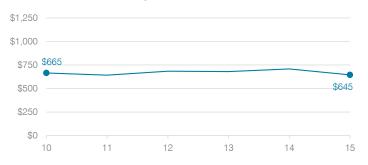
Changes in operational spending percentages

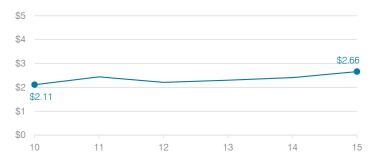
Administrative cost per student
