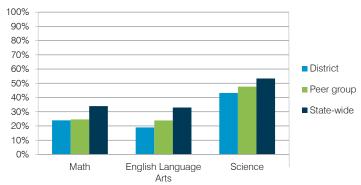

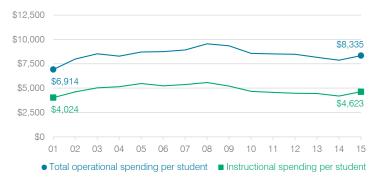

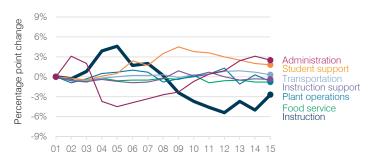
#### 5-year spending trend (2010 through 2015)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, decreased by 3 percent. The percentage of dollars spent in the classroom varied year to year, increasing overall from 54.5 to 55.5 percent. Overall, as a percentage of total operational spending, student support decreased substantially, food service decreased, and plant operations decreased slightly. Administration increased substantially.

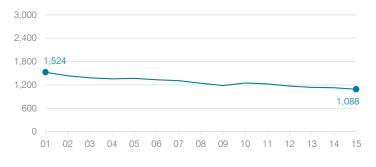
# Total operational and instructional spending per student (inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars)



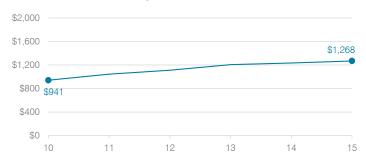
### Changes in operational spending percentages



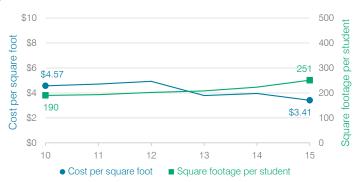

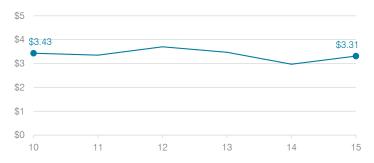
#### Administrative cost per student
