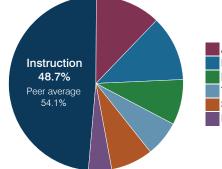

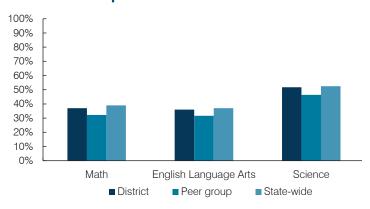

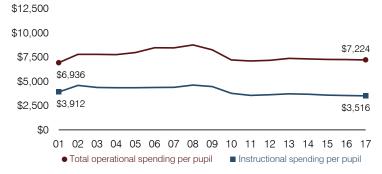

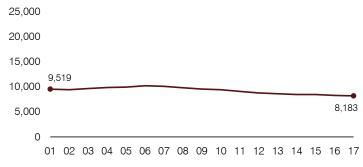
#### 5-year spending trend (2012 through 2017)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, increased by 1 percent. The percentage of dollars spent on instruction decreased from 50.5 to 48.7 percent. Overall, as a percentage of total operational spending, student support increased and administration, plant operations, and food service increased slightly, while instruction support decreased. Transportation remained stable.

#### Total operational and instructional spending per pupil (inflation adjusted to 2017 dollars)



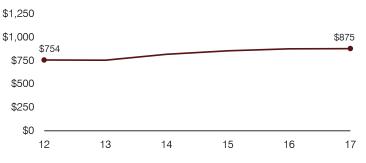

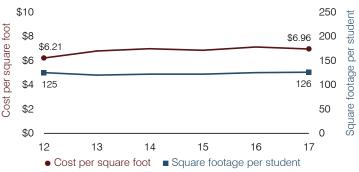

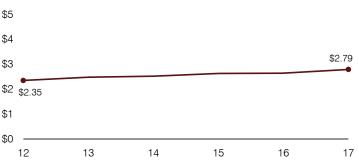
#### Administrative cost per pupil
